RULES:

- See General and Livestock Rules and Health Regulations governing this department.
- Owner's Social Security or Tax ID Number must be on all entries, Junior & Open. Please note, the payee must match the Social Security or Tax ID Number.
- Junior Exhibitors who enter the Open Show will be required to purchase the Exhibitors Admission Packet. The required pass will be \$20.00 and will be good for two individuals for 4 days entering the Livestock Gate.
- Where any dairy herd is registered in the names of different members of the same family residing on one farm and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as a single exhibitor for Exhibitors Herd, Best Three Females, Premier Exhibitor and Premier Breeder classes and Governor's Production Class.
- The following breeds will be offered in the Open Dairy Show and must have a minimum of 30 head entered to have a show. If less than 30 head are entered, they will show in a combined class. If a breed does not get 30 head and the exhibitor contacts within 10 working days after the August 15th deadline they may request a refund of entry fees.

Division 1012 – Open Brown Swiss
Division 1013 – Open Guernsey
Division 1014 – Open Holstein
Division 1015 – Open Jersey

- All accounts of owner must be in financial good standing to be eligible to enter the show ring. Any and all monies will be applied to entry and show fees before being applied to exhibitor admission tickets.

ENTRY INFORMATION:

- Payee's W-9 form must be included with entry.
- The exhibitor may make class substitutions on existing entries in the Livestock Show Office until 4:00 PM the day preceding the show.

ENTRY FEES (per head):

If postmarked by August 15:

- \$25.00 – Open Show Only

If postmarked after August 15 but by September 1:

- \$50.00 – Open Show Only

If postmarked after September 1 until 4:00 PM the day before the show:

- \$75.00 – Open Show Only

REQUIRED TO PURCHASE

- \$20.00 Exhibitor Admission Pack (2 Books of 4 Tickets, good for only 2 individuals for up to 4 days)

Additional Fees:

- Additional Tickets (pre-order for immediate family members) \$7.00 adult single day ticket, \$4.00 child single day ticket (ages 11-6) if postmarked by September 1, 2009. Also may purchase Season Pass for \$23.00 good for all 11 days.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR AND BREEDER AWARDS (awarded in each breed):

- Premier Exhibitor Award – The Exhibitor winning the most points not to exceed six animals owned and exhibited by himself or herself in the open single classes shall be designated the Premier Exhibitor. The scale of points will be the same as that for determining Premier Breeder.
- Premier Breeder Award – The Breeder winning the most points not to exceed six animals in the open single classes, exhibited by himself or herself and/or other exhibitors shall be designated the Premier Breeder. The Point system for determining the Premier Breeder and Exhibitor is as follows:
Senior Females, Points (1st-10th) 20, 18, 16, 14, 12, 10, 8, 6, 4, 2
Junior Females, Points (1st-10th) 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1

PDCA DAIRY HERDSMAN OF THE DAY AWARD:

- A selection committee will select the most outstanding junior or open herdsman the day of the show. Selection of the winner will be judged on the following:

The Supreme Champion will be selected by the judge of the open dairy cattle show from the Grand Champion females of the Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Holstein, Jersey and Milking Shorthorn breeds. This selection will be made at the end of the dairy show on Tuesday. The winner will be presented the Charles Griggs Memorial Award. Reserve Supreme Champion will receive the Don & Shirley Head Award.

CHARLES GRIGGS MEMORIAL AWARD

The Charles Griggs Memorial Award is presented to the Supreme Champion Female of the dairy show. This award is presented in recognition of a pioneer showman and outstanding breeder of Guernsey cattle in the state of Oklahoma. Charlie Griggs began exhibiting these cattle at major fairs and shows throughout the United States. Through the years Charlie exhibited the Grand Champion female at most of the state, regional and national shows he attended. His Golden Dew Farm prefix became synonymous with champion Guernsey cattle. His herd received the Premier Exhibitor and Breeder Awards at many of these show. The 1994 show season was to have been the 60th year for Charlie to exhibit Guernsey's at the Oklahoma State Fair®. Charlie's friends and family have made this award possible so that his memory will live on with the dairy exhibitors at the Oklahoma State Fair®. A permanent plaque will display the name of each year's winner. The Oklahoma State Fair® will present an individual plaque to the exhibitor of the Supreme Champion each year.

DON AND SHIRLEY HEAD AWARD

The Don and Shirley Head Award is presented to the Reserve Supreme Champion female of the dairy show. This award is presented in honor of the premier showman and breeders of brown Swiss cattle in the state of Oklahoma. Don and Shirley's Head's Crest prefix is recognized for outstanding show cattle, both have had the opportunity to serve on national committees such as national youth fun auction and national type committee. Don's ability as a cowman extraordinaire has been utilized by the national brown Swiss association as the national show judge in such foreign countries as Peru, Columbia and Ecuador. (Don and Shirley have held offices in the state level such as President, Vice President and Secretary of the Oklahoma Brown Swiss Association and the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association.) Don and Shirley's friends, family and Oklahoma Brown Swiss Association have made this award possible that their leadership and hard work will be an encouragement to other exhibitors at the Oklahoma State Fair®. A permanent plaque will display the names of each year's winner. The Oklahoma State Fair® will present an individual plaque to the exhibitor of the Reserve Supreme Champion each year.
