Deadline to receive ENTRY FORMS is August 15, 2009.

DO NOT MAIL YOUR RECIPES WITH YOUR ENTRY FORM. THE RECIPES NEED TO BE BROUGHT TO THE CREATIVE ARTS BUILDING WITH YOUR ENTRY. CANNED FRUITS AND VEGETABLES DO NOT NEED RECIPES. BE SURE YOUR NAME, CLASS NUMBER, AND DIVISION NUMBER IS ON EACH RECIPE. Recipes must be typed or printed on an 8 1/2 x 11" sheet of paper, including cooking or baking time and temperature.

NOTE: ALL BAKED GOODS BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE OKLAHOMA STATE FAIR AND WILL BE REMOVED WHEN SPOILED OR MOLDY. RECIPES BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE OKLAHOMA STATE FAIR, INCLUDING PUBLICATION RIGHTS.

Entry clerks will receive items at the Creative Arts Building at the following times:

Saturday, September 12, 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM

Sunday, September 13, 12:00 Noon to 5:00 PM

No one other than the superintendents, judges and clerks will be allowed to remain in the building during the judging.

All exhibits must be homemade and the work of the person making the entry, and free from adulteration. Exhibits must have been prepared since October 1, 2008. Any waste due to faulty canning or weather conditions must be at the exhibitor's risk.

All entries must be brought to the Fair on disposable plates, pans, boards, or glass dishes/pans. Entries will not be accepted if displayed in baskets. Articles will be tested to the satisfaction of the judge.

Baking entires below 3rd place and canning entries winning below 5th place may be picked up Tuesday, September 15, if desired, between 2:00 PM and 5:00 PM, in the Cooking Department. After 5:00 PM, no one is allowed in the building except employees.

Baked Goods ribbons will be mailed to the winners after October 10.

Special contest entries will be released immediately following the awards presentation.

PROFESSIONALS are considered to be persons receiving over 10% of their income from their craft, including teaching and/or instructing. PROFESSIONALS are not eligible, except as noted at the beginning of a division.

Baking and canning entries and ribbons will be released from 1:00 PM to 5:00 PM, Monday, September 28 and 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM, Tuesday, September 29, upon presentation of claim check.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

SECTION 1 – Entry Requirements

Entries are limited to bona fide residents of Oklahoma. No entry fee is required unless listed. Entries must be made by individuals ONLY unless specifically excepted.

PROFESSIONALS are considered to be persons receiving a major part or all of their income from their craft, including teaching and/or instructing of same. PROFESSIONALS are not eligible, except as noted at the beginning of a section.

Entry deadline for all departments is AUGUST 15. You may download entry forms or enter online from our Web site: www.okstatefair.com.

Exhibitors may make only one entry in each class unless otherwise stated.

No additions to entry forms will be accepted after the August 15 deadline.

All entry forms must be COMPLETELY filled out, or they will not be accepted.

Give a short description of the article entered in all miscellaneous classes or special classes.

Exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor except in the classes for Antiques and Collections. Antiques and Collections must be the bona fide property of exhibitor. Articles that have been entered at a previous Oklahoma State Fair are not eligible for entry, except as noted. All entries must be clean, and the metal must be polished and in good condition for display.

Should any article be entered in the wrong class, the superintendent may make proper correction in the entry, except as noted.

SECTION 2 - Exhibitor Duties and Privileges

If it is ascertained that an exhibitor has made any false statement in regard to any article or exhibit, or, if any exhibitor shall attempt to harass or interfere with the judge or judges in the performance of their duties, the exhibitor shall be excluded from competition and forfeit all premiums.

Exhibits in all departments — EXCEPT specific divisions of the Cooking Department — will be released from 1 PM to 5 PM, Monday, September 28, and 9 AM to 3 PM, Tuesday, September 29. No exhibits will be released early. If you have entries in the Cooking Department, check each division for pickup time. No exhibit will be released without presentation of claim check.

Every effort will be made to display entries in an attractive arrangement; however, items entered for competition will be displayed only through 3rd place. Other entries will be displayed only as space is available and at the discretion of the superintendents. The Oklahoma State Fair reserves the right to reject any exhibit offered if it is objectionable in any way, if it requires an excessive amount of space, or if the capacity of the department has been reached.

An Exhibitor may pick up a friend's articles by presenting claim check.

Any contest may be cancelled for lack of entries.

THE STATE FAIR IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR AND WILL DISPOSE OF ANY ARTICLES OR EXHIBITS LEFT AFTER 3:00 PM, TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 29.

Your items will be handled with care; however, Oklahoma State Fair, Inc. is not responsible for items that get damaged while on display during the Fair.

Any protest must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$50, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Said protest must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be filed with the Manager by Noon on Thursday, opening day of the Fair.

SECTION 3 - Awards

All cash prizes will be paid from the awards as marked by the judges and not from ribbons that may be attached to the exhibits. Judges are instructed not to award cash prizes or ribbons unless article or articles are deemed worthy of the placing awarded.

BEST OF SHOW payouts for the Creative Arts Department WILL be mailed to exhibitor after the close of the Fair.

Within 90 days from the last day of the 2009 Oklahoma State Fair, it is the responsibility of the Payee to file, in writing, a claim for lost or incorrect awards.

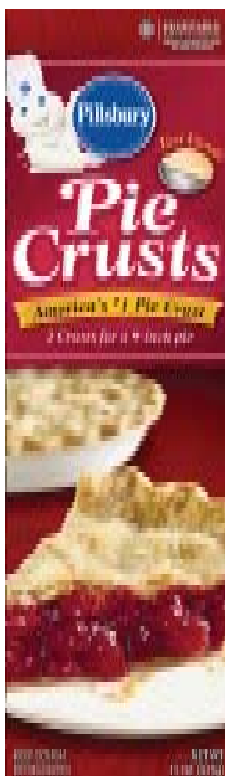
