Only one item can be entered per class unless noted otherwise.

Entry clerks will receive items at the Creative Arts Building at the following times: Saturday, September 12, 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM
Sunday, September 13, 12:00 Noon to 5:00 PM

Articles will be released from the Creative Arts Building, upon presentation of a claim check at the following times:

Monday, September 28, 1:00 PM to 5:00 PM
Tuesday, September 29, 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM

RULES AND REGULATIONS

SECTION 1 – Entry Requirements

Entries are limited to bona fide residents of Oklahoma. No entry fee is required unless listed. Entries must be made by individuals ONLY unless specifically excepted.

PROFESSIONALS are considered to be persons receiving a major part or all of their income from their craft, including teaching and/or instructing of same. PROFESSIONALS are not eligible, except as noted at the beginning of a section.

Entry deadline for all departments is AUGUST 15. You may download entry forms or enter online from our Web site: www.okstatefair.com.

Exhibitors may make only one entry in each class unless otherwise stated.

No additions to entry forms will be accepted after the August 15 deadline.

All entry forms must be COMPLETELY filled out, or they will not be accepted.

Give a short description of the article entered in all miscellaneous classes or special classes.

Exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor except in the classes for Antiques and Collections. Antiques and Collections must be the bona fide property of exhibitor. Articles that have been entered at a previous Oklahoma State Fair are not eligible for entry, except as noted. All entries must be clean, and the metal must be polished and in good condition for display.

Should any article be entered in the wrong class, the superintendent may make proper correction in the entry, except as noted.

SECTION 2 - Exhibitor Duties and Privileges

If it is ascertained that an exhibitor has made any false statement in regard to any article or exhibit, or, if any exhibitor shall attempt to harass or interfere with the judge or judges in the performance of their duties, the exhibitor shall be excluded from competition and forfeit all premiums.

Exhibits in all departments — EXCEPT specific divisions of the Cooking Department — will be released from 1 PM to 5 PM, Monday, September 28, and 9 AM to 3 PM, Tuesday, September 29. No exhibits will be released early. If you have entries in the Cooking Department, check each division for pickup time. No exhibit will be released without presentation of claim check.

Every effort will be made to display entries in an attractive arrangement; however, items entered for competition will be displayed only through 3rd place. Other entries will be displayed only as space is available and at the discretion of the superintendents. The Oklahoma State Fair® reserves the right to reject any exhibit offered if it is objectionable in any way, if it requires an excessive amount of space, or if the capacity of the department has been reached.

An Exhibitor may pick up a friend's articles by presenting claim check.

Any contest may be cancelled for lack of entries.

THE STATE FAIR IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR AND WILL DISPOSE OF ANY ARTICLES OR EXHIBITS LEFT AFTER 3:00 PM, TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 29.

Your items will be handled with care; however, Oklahoma State Fair, Inc. is not responsible for items that get damaged while on display during the Fair.

Any protest must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$50, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Said protest must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be filed with the Manager by Noon on Thursday, opening day of the Fair.

SECTION 3 - Awards

All cash prizes will be paid from the awards as marked by the judges and not from ribbons that may be attached to the exhibits. Judges are instructed not to award cash prizes or ribbons unless article or articles are deemed worthy of the placing awarded.

BEST OF SHOW payouts for the Creative Arts Department WILL be mailed to exhibitor after the close of the Fair.

Within 90 days from the last day of the 2009 Oklahoma State Fair, it is the responsibility of the Payee to file, in writing, a claim for lost or incorrect awards.

CLASS DEFINITIONS:

TRADITIONAL - A traditional basket is commonly woven of reed and cane. Reed is the inner core of rattan that has been cut into flat, round, and flat oval shapes. Cane is the bark of the vine. This vine grows in Indonesia and is cut and processed in China. Traditional baskets are used to carry or hold something and often have an over one/under one weave.

RIBBED – Ribbed baskets have spokes of round or oval material that extend from oneside to the other and are tucked into a God’s Eye, or other appropriate design, on either side of the basket. They can be woven on hoops or rings that are held in place by this design. They were used for gathering eggs, melons, and potatoes. Some are called key baskets or oriole baskets depending on their particular shape.

TWILL VARIATIONS – Twill weave is sometimes called herringbone weave. The spokes are flush against each other rather than spread apart as in traditional weaving. The basic weave is over and under a repeating number of spokes, forming a pattern or design. There are many variations that make designs such as a diamond, arrow, or “X”.

DOUBLE WALLED – A double walled basket is woven with an inside and outside wall.

COILED – A coiled basket is sewn together with such things as waxed linen, sinew, raffia or fabric. Typically, coiled baskets are made of fabric, pine needles or native grasses that are wound, tied or sewn in rows around the basket.

GATHERED MATERIALS – These baskets are made of things gathered from nature such as grapevine, honeysuckle, kudzu, grasses, bark and willow. They can be different shapes and can be woven many ways.

NON-TRADITIONAL/CONTEMPORARY – These baskets have unusual designs or are made of materials not usually associated with traditional basketry. Some examples of these materials are paper, ribbon, plastic strips, wire and yarn.

NON-WOOD – Non-wood baskets can be woven from anything other than wood, such as

DEVELOPMENTALLY DISABLED

Division 3521

Developmental Disability is defined by the developmental disabilities services division DDSDD General Provisions, section QAC 340:100-1-2 as:

A severe chronic disability of a person which is attributed to mental or physical impairment or combination of mental and physical impairments.

Results in substantial limitations in three or more of the following areas of major life activity: Self Care, Receptive & Expressive Language, Mobility, Learning, Self Direction, Capacity for Independent Living and Economic Self Sufficiency.

Mental Retardation is defined by DDSDD General Provisions, section QAC 340: 100-1-2 as: A condition which refers to substantial limitations in present intellectual functioning, existing concurrently with related limitations in two or more of the following applicable adaptive skill areas: Communication, self care, home living, social skills, community use, self direction, health & safety, functional academics, leisure and work.

Manifests before age 18.

Criteria for MR in accordance with DDSDD QAC 340: 100-3-1, All States that the individual "Be determined to have a disability with a diagnosis of mental retardation by the Social Security Administration or the DHS Medical Evaluation".
